

DECREE

St. Mary Parish of Minneiska, Minnesota, was founded in 1867, serving the faithful of the area for 155 years. Upon the extensive collaboration of clergy and lay leaders throughout the Diocese, the recommended, and eventual merging (*unio extinctiva*), of St. Mary Parish with St. Agnes Parish, Kellogg, Minnesota, became effective December 1, 2022.

In a letter presented to the Bishop and Presbyteral Council on May 9, 2023, the Pastor of St. Agnes Parish offered the following grave causes which suggest that the church building of the former parish of St. Mary be relegated to profane but not sordid use:

- 1. The necessary human and fiscal resources to adequately maintain the structure are no longer available. Hence, maintaining the building as a place of worship would place an excessive burden upon St. Agnes Parish.
- The people who once attended St. Mary Parish are in close proximity to several other parishes, including St. Agnes Parish. Use of the church building for divine worship or any other activity will be infrequent or nonexistent.
- 3. Having made public the possibility of the sale or razing of the church building, no member has expressed a legitimate interest in maintaining the church building.
- Funds raised from the sale of the church property will provide support for other dimensions of the Church's pastoral ministry and mission, particularly the perpetual care of neighboring cemeteries.

Accordingly, in virtue of the prescription of canon 1222, §2 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law, having consulted the Presbyteral Council on May 9, 2023, having judged that sufficient grave causes are present, having determined that the good of souls will suffer no detriment

and that the intentions of donors and any other acquired rights have been examined and given due consideration, I hereby decree that

ST. MARY PARISH OF MINNEISKA, MINNESOTA BE RELEGATED TO PROFANE BUT NOT SORDID USE.

This decree becomes effective July 1, 2023. A copy of this decree is to be sent to the pastor of St. Agnes Parish and its contents are to be communicated at all Masses of obligation on the weekend of Saturday, June 17, 2023, and Sunday, June 18, 2023. Furthermore, this decree is to be published on the diocesan website. Any legitimate party, considering himself aggrieved by this decree, retains the right to request emendation or revocation within ten (10) useful days (c. 1734, §§1, 2).
